### STRUCTURE, GOVERNANCE AND MANAGEMENT

Sgoil an lochdair agus a'Choimhearsnachd was incorporated as a company limited by guarantee on 9 June 2005, on which date it acquired the entire assets and liabilities of Sgoil an lochdair agus a'Choimhearsnachd, an unincorporated body. The trust was established under a Memorandum of Association which established the objects and powers of the charitable company and it is governed by its Articles of Association. In the event of the trust being wound up, each member may be required to contribute up to £1. The company is recognised as a Scottish charity under reference SC032387.

### Report of the Trustees for the Year Ended 30 June 2014

### STRUCTURE, GOVERNANCE AND MANAGEMENT

### Recruitment and appointment of new trustees

Membership is open to all individuals and organisations, with the exception of employees of the trust. Individuals aged 18 or over living in, or a member of an amateur sports or recreational organisation in, the catchment area of the lochdair School are eligible for membership as ordinary members. All other individuals and organisations may become associate members; such members are neither eligible to stand for election to the Board nor to vote at any general meeting.

Subject to the conditions set out in the Articles of Association, the board shall consist of up to three elected trustees, up to three appointed trustees and up to one co-opted trustee, appointed at the AGM. The board may fill any vacancy arising as a result of a retirement until the next AGM.

All trustees and ordinary members, who have paid their current subscription fee, are entitled to take part in any general meetings and each have one vote. The chairperson has an additional casting vote when necessary.

### Organisational structure

The board of trustees currently manage the trust.

### Risk management

The trustees have a duty to identify and review the risks to which the charity is exposed and to ensure appropriate controls are in place to provide reasonable assurance against fraud and error.

### OBJECTIVES AND ACTIVITIES

### Objectives and aims

The object of the trust is to support recreation and sport in the catchment area of the lochdair school, in particular:

- to promote interest and participation in sport, and related recreations in the catchment area of the lochdair School, especially in the interests of education, social welfare and health.
- to assist in the coordination of various sports clubs and recreational organisations operating in the catchment area, both generally and in relation to specific projects.
- to examine the available sports and recreation facilities in the lochdair area as against current and anticipated need and to make application to the local council, local enterprise trust and any other appropriate body in this connection.
- to liaise with the council's sports development staff in furtherance of these objects.
- to raise funds for such charitable purposes as the association may deem appropriate.

### Report of the Trustees for the Year Ended 30 June 2014

### ACHIEVEMENT AND PERFORMANCE

In March 2014 we met for our eighth AGM, reviewing the year 2012-2013 and setting our aims for 2013-2014. Our main aim in the year was to develop the plans for the football pitch.

For 2013-2014 we set ourselves the following objectives:

- General maintenance of benches and tree planted areas.
- To develop the pitch plans for lochdar Hall
- 3. Liaison with the school, pupils and parents' council concerning the maintenance and development of the school playground.
- 4. Liaison with third parties with reference to footpaths
- Involving other groups especially potential user groups
- 6. Fundraising

### General maintenance of facilities, benches and tree planted areas:

We undertook a planned litter clearance day, tidying around the Creagorry o-op

We have agreement for the placement of amenity seating at the graveyard at Ardivachair and at the social housing at Rubha Doigeag. We have raised sufficient funds for the benches.

We arranged for the repair of the shelter at lochdar School, and have raised funds and enough stone to erect a stone wall at lochdar School.

We continue to keep the path at lochdar road end clear from grass.

### 2. To develop the pitch plans for lochdar Hall

We used funding for awards for all to commission plans for the football pitch. These are now being costed so that we can start raising funds towards the construction of the pitch.

### 3. Liaison with the school, pupils and parents' council

We have continued to keep lochdar School informed of our activities. We are also in contact with the council concerning general maintenance issues around the school and play areas, including drainage.

### 4. Liaison with third parties with reference to footpaths:

We have kept in touch with Angela at the WISE project. She has been invited to present her work to us.

### 5. Involving other groups and user groups

The following groups were members of our organisation in 2013-2014:

- lochdar Saints Football club

We have maintained links with:

We continue to maintain a website and a facebook page. One of our trustees sits on the Local Advisory Group for the council's development office. Another trustee is a member of the board of trustees for Storas Uibhist.

Our secretary, Dr Dawson, represented the association when she carried the baton for the Commonweath Games.

### ACHIEVEMENT AND PERFORMANCE

Charitable activities

During the accounting year, we continued to raise funds for recurring costs.

### FINANCIAL REVIEW

Reserves policy

The trustees have examined the requirement for free reserves which are those unrestricted funds not invested in fixed assets, designated for specific purposes or otherwise committed but do not yet have a formal policy in place. At the balance sheet date the trust held unrestricted funds of £10,958 (2013 - £11,937) of which £5,755 were invested in fixed assets (2013 - £6,033).

Principal funding sources

Funding was received from Awards for All and will be expended after the year end on detailed plans for the football pitch at lochdar

#### FUTURE DEVELOPMENTS

The trust's main aim remains to improve opportunities for outdoor activities for children and adults living in the catchment area of lochdair School. Some of the forthcoming projects include:

- Parking facilities at lochdar Hall
- Interpretative signage for walks
- Sculpture/outdoor art installation
- Griminish Play Park
- Creagorry Play Park
- Walks and footpaths
- Adventure trail through the trees
- Installation of amenity benches
- Further development of the playing fields at lochdar School

#### **ACCOUNTING POLICIES** 1.

Accounting convention

The financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention, and in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard for Smaller Entities (effective April 2008), the Companies Act 2006 and the requirements of the Statement of Recommended Practice, Accounting and Reporting by Charities.

All gains and losses are reported in the Statement of Financial Activities, and all income is derived from continuing activities, unless otherwise stated

Incoming resources

All incoming resources are included on the Statement of Financial Activities when the charity is legally entitled to the income and the amount can be quantified with reasonable accuracy. Grants, where entitlement is not conditional on the delivery of a specific performance by the trust, are recognised when the charity becomes unconditionally entitled to the grant. Long-term membership subscriptions are recognised in full on receipt.

Donations in kind are valued at cost, or the trustees estimation thereof, in the period in which the goods or services are received.

Resources expended

Expenditure is accounted for on an accruals basis and has been classified under appropriate headings which aggregate all relevant costs. Where expenditure cannot be directly attributed to particular headings it has been allocated to activities on a basis consistent with the use of resources.

The charity is not registered for VAT purposes and costs therefore include the irrecoverable element of VAT with the item of expenditure to which it relates.

Charitable expenditure comprises those costs incurred by the charity in the delivery of its activities and services to beneficiaries. It includes both costs that can be directly allocated to such activities and those costs of an indirect nature necessary to support them.

Costs of generating funds comprise the costs associated with attracting voluntary income with the exclusion of those costs associated with delivering or supporting the charity's objects.

Governance costs include those costs associated with meeting the constitutional and statutory requirements of the charity and include accountancy fees and costs relating to the strategic management of the charity.

Tangible fixed assets

Depreciation is provided at the following annual rates in order to write off each asset over its estimated useful life.

Heritable property Leasehold improvements Plant & machinery

- not provided, on land and related costs
- 4% on cost and 2% on cost
- 15% on reducing balance

#### Taxation

The charity is exempt from corporation tax on its charitable activities.

Fund accounting

Unrestricted funds can be used in accordance with the charitable objectives at the discretion of the trustees.

Restricted funds can only be used for particular restricted purposes within the objects of the charity. Restrictions arise when specified by the donor or when funds are raised for particular restricted purposes.

Further explanation of the nature and purpose of each fund is included in the notes to the financial statements.

Operating lease commitments

Rental payments due under operating lease contracts are charged to the SOFA as incurred. Lease commitments at the balance sheet date are disclosed in the notes to the accounts.

### 9. MOVEMENT IN FUNDS - continued

Resources expended against the 'lochdair School playground', 'Cycle racks' and 'Fencing' funds include depreciation of assets purchased with these restricted funds.

'lochdair School playground' funds of £152,733 were held as fixed assets at the balance sheet date. The remaining amounts are carried forward to be expended on further costs and amounts retained for the defects period.

'Cycle racks' and 'Fencing' funds have been fully expended and funds represent the net book value of fixed assets purchased with these funds.

'Tree planting maintenance' funds are carried forward to be expended in accordance with the terms of this fund.

The 'Awards for All' fund has been carried forward and will be expended after the year end on detailed plans for the football pitch at lochdar Hall.
